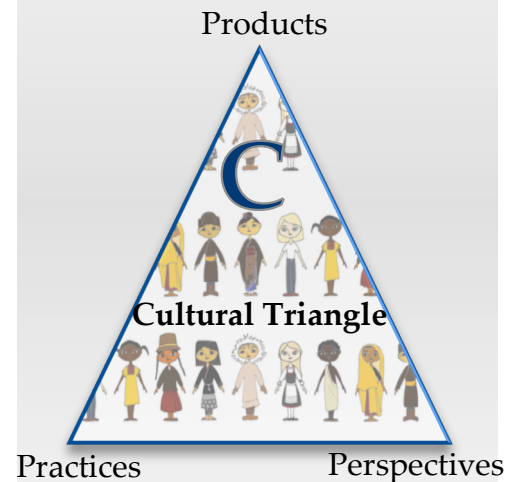

What can students expect in the middle grades partial immersion program?

Partial Immersion students will have the opportunity to continue their language learning on a new journey into the world during their middle school years. Students will take 2 courses in the target language:

- French/Spanish Language Arts (as part of the core)
 - This course will help students begin to focus on how the language works. Students will begin more in depth studies of the language itself, literature and cultural idioms. Accuracy, grammar and literacy will become more emphasized in this phase of their language learning.
- Passport to the French/Spanish Speaking World
 - Conducted in the target language using a hands-on, project-based learning approach, learners will communicate and collaborate with students and experts from across the country and the target cultures to explore real-world problems and cultural practices.
 - This course comprises of 4 - 9 week studies of target countries. The Cultural Triangle is the foundation of the study, research project or service-learning project for each country. Through a study of practices, perspectives and products of a culture, learners will learn through collaborative projects focused on the social sciences (economics/history/geography), performing arts, cultural arts, culinary arts and political perspectives of the target country. Insight into the culture and its practices and perspectives will assist the learners in completing their real-world project.
